### John J. Wright Memorial Scholarship Program 2020 Scholarship Application

John J. Wright was the founder of the John J. Wright School in Snell, Virginia. Education was his greatest love. The scholarship fund, established in 1994, is intended to continue his efforts on behalf of (1) the children of John J. Wright Alumni, and (2) other African American children of Spotsylvania, Virginia.

The John J. Wright Memorial Scholarship Program is accepting applications from:

- 1) high school students who will graduate spring 2020 and who are planning to attend a technical school, community college, or a four-year college or university in fall 2020 ("high school applicants") on a full time basis;
- persons who have graduated from high school and who are planning to attend a technical school, community college, or a four-year college or university in fall 2020 as a full-time student ("first time applicants"); and
- full-time students who are planning to return to a technical school, community college, or a four-year college or university in fall 2020 as a full-time student ("returning student applicants").

First time applicants and full time returning students maintaining a 2.5 grade point average (GPA) on a four point grading scale in their freshman, sophomore, or junior year, and meeting all other eligibility criteria, may apply for a stipend of up to \$1,000.00.

Applicants can receive a scholarship and/or stipend no more than four (4) times.

The complete application package must be submitted to the scholarship committee no later than **April 15. 2020** and contain the following:

- 1) High school applicant package checklist:
  - □ a <u>completed</u> scholarship application form
  - an official, sealed, high school transcript that includes the cumulative GPA
  - two (2) recommendations (one from a teacher and one from an official of one of the following: current school, community organization, church, or employer)
  - □ a written essay
  - □ small photo
- 2) First time applicant package checklist:
  - □ a <u>completed</u> scholarship application form
  - an official, sealed, high school or college transcript that includes the cumulative GPA
  - two (2) recommendations (from an official of one or more of the following: current school, community organization, church, or employer)
  - a written essay
  - □ small photo
- 3) Returning student applicant package checklist:
  - □ a <u>completed</u> scholarship application form
  - a one page essay on community service conducted within the last 12 months
  - □ an <u>official</u> sealed college transcript that includes the cumulative GPA

# APPLICATION PACKAGES MUST BE MAILED AND POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN

April 15, 2020. Application packaged postmarked after April 15, 2020 WILL NOT be considered. Mail applications to:

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## **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

- Applicant must be an "active financial member" of the John J. Wright Alumni Association, or the offspring of an "active financial member" of the Alumni Association (offspring may be a biological, step, adopted or foster child or a grandchild). The member, upon whom the applicant is basing his or her eligibility, must be an "active financial" and "current year 2020" member of the Alumni Association AND a member for at least two consecutive years prior to the year of application (2018 and 2019)). Membership dues must be paid by April 15 of the current year.
- High School applicants must be graduating from an accredited secondary educational institution. All other applicants must have graduated from an accredited secondary educational institution.
- Returning student applicants must be <u>full-time students</u> returning to a technical school, community college, or four-year college or university.
- High School applicants and first-time applicants must have applied for admission to at least one accredited technical school, community college, or four-year college or university.
- High School applicants and first-time applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher. Returning student applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- All high school and first time applicants must provide two (2) recommendations from an official of one or more of the following: current school, community organization, church, or employer. One (1) of the two recommendations must be from a high school teacher if applicant is in high school.
- A small high school picture and a brief bio for high school and first time applicants are required. The bio can be included on the application form.
- A personal interview, consisting of an oral presentation of the applicant's essay and a question/response period, may be required.
- <u>A sealed official transcript must be provided to the Scholarship Committee with the</u> <u>applicant package</u>.
- Applicant must provide proof they are enrolled in school for the fall semester before receipt of scholarship/stipend.
- Beginning in 2019, returning students applicants must show they participated in at least one JJWAA event, meeting, or activity during the previous year i.e., April 2019 through April 2020. See the website for opportunities to join the association, engage with membership, support events, conduct community service, etc.
- Applicant must agree to return any scholarship award if applicant does not attend an educational institution or technical school in fall 2020.

#### Application Essav

All graduating high school applicants and first time applicants must submit a double spaced, typewritten essay, 300 to 500 words in length, on <u>one</u> of the following topics:

- 1) "My chosen field of study is ...because..."
- 2) "My community, church or family has influenced me..."
- 3) "It is important for me to attend college or training because..."

All returning students must submit a double spaced, typewritten essay, one page in length, on the following topic:

"It is important for me to do community service so I (**did what?**) over the last year in my community, church, school, etc, to"

**Failure** to address one of the specified topics disqualifies the essay and the application from consideration for a scholarship award.
